Injuries at Work

CONSTRUCTION

Injury Type: Broken ribs, internal injuries

Core Activity: Masonry

Location: Lower Mainland

ID Number: 2010157530422 Date of Accident: 2010-Dec

A worker stepped onto a tarped skylight, believing it was a stack of bricks, and fell through the skylight to the concrete floor 11 feet below.

Injury Type: Serious burns

Core Activity: Low slope roofing

Location: Lower Mainland

ID Number: 2010157560393 Date of Accident: 2010-Dec

Flammable vapours from a roofing primer accumulated in a hoarding enclosure and ignited when a torch was lit nearby. One of two workers in the

area was engulfed in flames and had to run through the flames to safety.

Injury Type: Crush injuries to hand

Core Activity: Drilling

Location: Lower Mainland

ID Number: 2010154890286 Date of Accident: 2010-Dec

A worker was assisting the operator of a drilling rig and was using a wrench to break the drill steel. The worker's hand became caught between the head of the drill and the table.

Injury Type: Hip injuries

Workers who were not wearing respirators or other protective equipment were removing building materials (flooring, drywall, roofing) from a wooden structure. The hazardous materials survey conducted after the work was nearly completed found that one of the materials removed contained asbestos.
