Incident Reports Reinstated

At the request of COCA, WorkSafeBC has reinstated the publication of Incident Reports for the Construction Industry. The Reports also have more detail.

These reports, which are summaries of workplace incidents, serve as a valuable reminder of the need for workplace health and safety.

The reports are useful for Toolbox Talks, Health & Safety Committee discussions, and especially for the orientation of new workers.

Please feel free to post the information on your Safety Bulletin Boards.

This first report in the new series covers incidents that occurred in the month of May, 2013.

The June report will be sent out shortly.

Injury: Minor injury to one finger

Industry: Construction
Core Activity: Road building

Location: Vancouver Island/Coastal B.C.

Date of Incident: 2013-May

A 7-ton roller was compacting the sub-base in preparation for paving. The operator was working the drum incrementally to the edge of the road when it caught a soft spot in the substrate at the embankment edge. The operator attempted to correct the roller but the substrate gave way, taking the roller with it. The machine rolled onto its side and slid down the steep embankment (1.5/1) for about 5 metres. The operator, who was wearing his seatbelt and a hardhat, sustained minor injuries.

Injury: Fatal

Industry: Construction, Forestry, Services (NES), Trucking

Core Activity: Transmission line installation

Location: Interior B.C. Date of Incident: 2013-May

A water truck backed up along a narrow section of a forest service road. The vehicle approached the edge of the road surface, where one tire on the passenger side of the vehicle went off the road. The vehicle tipped over and travelled about 110 metres down a 100% slope, then struck a tree.

A worker accessed a three-frame-tall scaffold (frames of 5 feet by 5 feet) where a ladder was placed on the top of the work platform. When the worker used the ladder, the scaffolding tipped over. The worker then fell to the ground.

While a worker was carrying metal roofing material across a wet, sloped barn roof, he slipped, slid down the roof, and fell 12 feet, 4 inches to the ground. No fall protection equipment was being used at the time of the incident.

Injury: Injury to head, possible fracture to arm, lower body pain

Two workers were on a conveyor belt tensioning it at the tail pulley. One worker fell off the end of the conveyor belt and landed on the ground 24 feet below.

A grader was grading uphill on a gravel road with a 10 percent slope, preparing for a logging operation. For an unknown reason, the grader reversed out of control and proceeded down the slope backwards. It is believed that the operator exited the grader while it was travelling backwards and was subsequently crushed by the grader blade.

A bulldozer was pushing garbage near a sloped embankment when the right side of the tracks sunk in. The operator then put the transmission into reverse and bulldozer started to roll onto its side. It rolled over one-and-a-half times, coming to rest on its side. After it came to rest, the operator was able to escape from the cab through an escape door.

The operator felt current while standing on the truck's deck and jumped to the ground. The materials on the deck caught fire, as did the tires and hydraulic lines. The fire department and utility company both attended the site. The truck and crane were ordered to be removed by tow truck for testing and recertification.
